However, there is something more pressing that I must appeal for your prayers and financial support.



basic supplies and they are in desperate need of resources. In the news, we have also seen the earthquake damaged area of Les Cayes has been cut off from Port-au-prince by violent gangs controlling the passage in between.



having the 2nd least access to fresh water in the world. The poor people of Haiti have suffered a seemingly endless string of devastating events including hurricanes, major earthquakes, political uprisings, droughts, famines, presidential assassinations, and government corruption. And let's not forget COVID.
